Community Advisory Committee

The Community Advisory Committee (CAC) works with the South East Special Education Local Plan Area (SE SELPA) to serve as a resource for parents of children with special needs.

The CAC serves in an advisory capacity to the SE SELPA regarding special education and related services provided to students with special needs.

The SE SELPA is a consortium of 11 school districts and the Santa Clara County Office of Education that ensures the availability of a continuum of special education programs and services for individuals with special needs from birth through 22 years of age.





Who Are We?

The CAC primarily consists of district boardappointed representatives who are parents of students with special needs. Other members may include regular and special education teachers, administrators, and community members.

What Do We Do?

The CAC exists to promote community awareness of unique needs of children with special needs as well as programs and services to them and their families.

The CAC's work includes support for parents of children with special needs, monthly evening information sessions, and dissemination of important information through an email distribution list.

Our CAC also coordinates special needs education, training for parents and educators, and special events.
